Entrepreneurship for Societal Development

Societal Development can be understood in terms of the fulfillment of human goals, i.e. Right Understanding and Right Feeling in every individual, Prosperity in every family, Fearlessness (Trust) in society, and Coexistence in Nature. According to Jean-Baptiste Say (1767-1832), a French economist, an entrepreneur is a person who "undertakes" an idea and shifts perspectives in a way that alters the effect that an idea has on society. There can be several ways to look at entrepreneurship like this. But with a holistic perspective, entrepreneurship is the sincere effort undertaken to fulfill the human goal. Thus, every person who makes this sincere effort to take responsibility for oneself is an entrepreneur.

With this, a question arises: what kind of mindset does an entrepreneur have? Taking reference from Mr. Deepak Bajaj (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=sjKf4rRVHe8&t=375s>), he has proposed Seven Key Points that mark the mindset of an entrepreneur, and they are listed below:

1. Absolute Ownership of Task at Hand
2. Taking More Initiatives
3. Doing More and Talking Less
4. Law of Extra
5. Finishing What You Start
6. Emotional Resilience
7. Feedback System

Elaborating on the above-mentioned points, it is expected that an entrepreneur takes complete responsibility for the task at hand, and does need any reminder. S(he) avoids making excuses and does not carry grudges or complaints against people. S(he) also volunteers for new tasks and keeps learning new skills on the way. It is also expected that s(he) tends to take initiative and develop competence/skills gradually. An entrepreneur generally promises less and delivers more, trying to make the right evaluation of oneself and improve upon it. S(he) tries to do somewhat more than what is expected and does a regular practice. Another thing to note is that an entrepreneur finishes what s(he) starts, finding creative ways to accomplish the task. One also needs emotional resilience as the situations may be sometimes favorable and sometimes unfavorable. There has to be the ability to continue despite all challenges and setbacks, accepting mistakes while trying. One also needs to take feedback regularly, doing more of what is working and less of what is not.

Having said all this, there is a word of caution. The qualities mentioned can be misleading if not utilized with the right understanding and right feeling (e.g. can be used for accumulation and indulgence if not based on right understanding). We need to be aware that the basic aspiration of each one of us is continuity of happiness and prosperity, and not excitement or accumulation. In other words, the qualities mentioned are not meant for getting happiness from the outside, but to ensure happiness inside, and sharing outside.
